## Best Booths of Art Basel in Miami Beach 2018

After a vernissage VIP opening yesterday, **Art Basel in Miami Beach** officially opened to the public today. The 17th edition of the fair brings together 268 galleries from 34 countries in the newly renovated Miami Beach Convention Center. <u>Whitewall</u> was at the preview event on Wednesday, and found a few favorite booths we'll share with you here.

Almine Rech curated a selectin of work from her impressive roster of artists. We loved colorful works by Vivian Springford and John M Armleder, a collage by Tom Wesselmann, and Joe Andoe's *Rainbow Road #2*. Also presented are major pieces by Farah Atassi, Aaron Curry, Rainer Fetting, Günther Förg, Jason Fox, Michael Hilsman, and Markus Lüpertz.



Gladstone Gallery © Keith Haring Foundation **Gladstone Gallery** is showing a special installation of rare works by **Keith Haring** made from 1981-1990. Included in the intimately domestic, red-painted booth, are painted screens, glass windows, a terracotta vase, a Japanese lamp, and several early subway drawings, many pieces on view have not been seen since they were made. The sometimes surprising pieces showcase the late artist's vastly ranging practice.

Jack Shainman's booth is always one we look forward to seeing at Art Basel in Miami Beach. This year the gallery is showing work by Nina Chanel Abney, El Anatsui, Radciffe Bailey, Yoan Capote, Geoffrey Chadsey, Barkley L. Hendricks, Enrique Martinez Celaya, Richard Mosse, and others. Of note are photos by Gordon Parks, Kerry James Marshall, and Carrie Mae Weems, as several sculptures by Gehard Demetz and Nick Cave.





Within the Nova section, **Josh Lilley**'s solo presentation of **Derek Fordjour** caught our eye. The artist transformed the booth into an exploration of the art market—both his involvement and frustrations with the industry. Fordjour used curious materials like pea gravel and barbed wire to create "BACKROOM," which includes painting, sculpture, and performance.

David Kordansky brought an impressive group of works from its artists this year. Standout pieces (many made this year) for us included *Licorice* by Kathryn Andrews, *GM* by Huma Bhabha, *Construct* by Sam Gilliam, *that fuss wuz us* by Lauren Halsey, *Shoots of an Inverted Tree* by Evan Holloway, *Saturn Returns (After Midnight)* by Chris Martin, and *Sun Disk* by Ruby Neri.



Chris Martin Saturn Returns (After Midnight) 2018 Courtesy of the artist and David Kordansky Lehmann Maupin reportedly sold out nearly its entire booth in the early hours of yesterday's preview, including pieces by Nari Ward, Liza Lou, McArthur Binion, Teresita Fernández, Angel Otero, Mr., Hernan Bas, Tracey Emin, and Kader Attia. The gallery is also showing a solo presentation of South African artist Nicholas Hlobo within Art Basel's Kabinett sector, which explores themes of masculinity and sexual identity through sculptures and works on paper.

**Perrotin**'s booth is hard to miss, with a major installation by **Paola Pivi** covering one section of it's floor, walls, and even ceiling. Entitled *What goes round – art comes round* (2010), it is made up of 24 fake fur bear-shaped rugs in brown and white. Beyond the immersive piece are works by **Daniel Arsham, Leslie Hewitt, Hans Hartung, Jean-Michel Othoniel, Takashi Murakami**, and others.

> Artist **Theaster Gates** is a center piece of **White Cube**'s booth at the fair. His *A Communistic Romance* (2017) is made up of 83 editions of Jet magazine, with a poem by the artist on each spine. Gates is also showing *Water Erosion on Brittle Black Surface* (2018) in bronze. Other highlights include a major work by **Al Held** from 1969, and art from **Antony Gormley, Mona Hatoum, Christian Marclay,** and **Beatriz Milhazes**.
