"The Eli's Cheesecake Cookbook" by **Maureen Schulman, Tara Lane, Diana Moles** and **Jolene Worthington** was published by Agate Midway earlier this month. The book looks at the history of the Chicago-style cheesecake as created at Eli's The Place for Steak and includes 40 cheesecake recipes. Schulman, Worthington and Moles live in Chicago.

"Six Remarkable Hull-House Women" by **Ruth Bobick** was published by Peter E. Randall Publisher in November. Bobick examines the history of Hull House through the stories of Jane Addams, Julia Lathrop, Florence Kelley, Alice Hamilton, and Grace and Edith Abbott.

"Slow Ball Cartoonist" by **Tony Garel-Frantzen** will be published by Purdue University Press in January. The biography of former Tribune cartoonist and Pulitzer Prize-winner John T. McCutcheon explores his Indiana roots, career and personal life. Garel-Frantzen lives in Buffalo Grove.

"It's. Nice. Outside." by **Jim Kokoris** was published by St. Martin's this month. In the novel, a father struggling with his station in life embarks on a road trip with his autistic son en route to the wedding of his daughter. Kokoris lives in the Chicago area.

"Two-Seven Remainder: A Novel" by **Matt Hader** was published by Amika earlier this month. A man who is ordered by his Chicago Outfit bosses to take a job in a 911 dispatch center becomes disillusioned with criminal life and attempts to shut down the Outfit. Hader lives in Barrington.
